


# Overview of Treatment Demand and Treatment Provision in Ukraine


## Outpatient psychiatric care for people with SUD

The bigger a circle, the more people with SUD (F10–F19) were provided with outpatient psychiatric care in 2020. In shades of green – 161 public facilities with more than 50% of people with SUD (out of total, F00–F99, in service). In shades of orange – 361 public facilities with less than 50% of people with SUD (out of total, F00–F99, in service).




## Inpatient psychiatric care for people with SUD

The bigger a circle, the more people with SUD (F10–F19) were provided with inpatient psychiatric care in 2020. In shades of green – 43 public facilities with more than 50% of people with SUD (out of total, F00–F99, in service). In shades of orange – 59 public facilities with less than 50% of people with SUD (out of total, F00–F99, in service).




## **EFSQ** survey

189 units within 129 facilities participated in EFSQ survey (in 25 regions of Ukraine). In purple – 48 units within 21 **specialized** (in the mental health field) public facilities. In blue – 139 units within 106 **general** public facilities.


#### Proportion (%) of clients whose main reason for treatment was related to:
